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#### **Foreword Message**


I am delighted to present the Annual Report for the year 2012. Despite financial constraints, a number of new initiatives and new ideas were started for the betterment of the institution as a whole.

This Annual Report manifests the human capital of the University be the staff or the students, possessed with the potential to

wriggle out of the inertia of past practices and rise to a respectable level of performance. Admittedly, we still have to go a long way. During the Academic year in the University of Balochistan, teaching and learning processes continued uninterruptedly and university did not close for a single day. The credit for this goes to the faculty members and indeed to all our students. The student as a body have collectively shown a great sense of wisdom and balance and have remained focused on their studies, reconfirming our faith and hopes in the youth of Balochistan.

In Year 2012, University of Balochistan produced 63 M.Phil/Ph.D which is the largest in one year time. The faculty produced 175 Research Articles in various Research Journals of International and National repute enhanced considerably than last year despite the fact that we are short of qualified teachers, almost one hundred senior faculty positions are vacant. Another milestone has been the Best Scientists Award which was received by our four faculty members for their contribution and exemplary performance as Scientists.

In linkages we signed MoUs with BUITEMS and SBK, Quetta which will be beneficial for all stakeholders. Quality Assurance Directorate prepared SARS (Self-Assessment Reports) of 9 Departments. Through FTDC we hold various training programs during said period. Over 30 Training were held during the period. Whenever need arise the Administrative Staff were sent for training to NIM and Accounts & Audit Academy at Quetta. Over 3000 students were admitted in various programs UA/FA (University Advancement/ Financial Aid) granted 180 need basis scholarships. Sports Directorate organized various sport activities. Botanical Garden 7 and Tissue Culture lab helped the researches in the field of their specialization and also busy to produce those plants which could survive better in Baluchistan's Climate.. 5 Million worth books in total 3000 were purchased for Central Library. 15.248 vaccines were produced by CASVAB. Meetings of Board of Advance Studies & Research, Academic Council were held during 2012 along with Several Departmental Board of Studies.

#### Introduction:

The University of Balochistan, Quetta is the oldest educational Institution of higher learning of the province entrusted with the responsibilities to educate and train the potentially talented human resource and manpower to meet the emerging needs of the industry and society. It plays a vital role in development of Pakistan in general and Balochistan in particular. The province of Balochistan is passing through a process of rapid socio-economic development which needs well qualified and competent scientists, professionals, academicians and administrators. The University is cognizant of this need and prepared to provide meaningful higher education to the youth of the province.

#### Historial Background

Historically the establishment of the University of Balochistan synchronized with the emergence of Balochistan as a province of Pakistan. The University came into being with the promulgation of the University of Balochistan Ordinance 1970, by covering an area of 150 acre of land in mineral technology college initially having two faculties that were Science and Arts: The science faculty was consisted of Physics, Chemistry, Geology and Mathematics, and the Faculty of Arts was consisted of English, Urdu, Economics, Political Science, Sociology, Social work, Education and Commerce and Islamic studies.

There were over all 104 faculty members (in arts 55 and 29 in science). The University had a constituent college and 1 affiliated medical college. Further after few years of establishment federal government opened 3 study centers that were Pakistan Study Center, Balochistan Study Center and Mideast study center. Further 9 degree colleges (8 for boys and 1 for girls) were also affiliated with university of Balochistan. The university library had 26508 books, initially.

The University offers graduate, postgraduate, doctoral and advanced programs of studies in Basic Sciences, Management Business and IT, Life Science, Earth and Environmental Sciences, Education and Humanities, Social Sciences and in Literature and Languages Profession al Disciplines. BS four years program of studies in certain disciplines of science are also offered by the University.

The University of Balochistan began functioning in March, 1971 with the opening of the Departments of Physics, Chemistry and Geology at the postgraduate level. At present, the University has 43 departments, two Institutes and six specialized centers of Higher Studies and Research, one constituent Law College and 44 affiliated colleges including Agriculture College, the Bolan Medical College, and Quetta Medical College CMH Quetta Cant.

## **RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT**



#### CHAPTER 2 RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

The University of Balochistan places great emphasis on Research and Development. The University facilitates and promote research friendly environment. Research Projects / Components of the University of Balochistan are ongoing and some are already completed (Particulars mentioned in Chapter No. 7); the details of HRD component status (Scholarships) are produced in Chapter No. 4 of this report.

#### Facilities:

UoB is equipped with state of art facilities that prove as a key ingredient in improving research and development environment. Some of the key facilities are highlighted and discussed below:

#### Central Library:

Library plays a vital role in the academic life of a University. The fundamental role of the library being educational, it should not be considered as mere storehouse of books, but as a dynamic instrument of education. Similarly the Central Library of the University is organized on these lines. The library collections support not only every course in the curriculum but also include selected stock of general material of books, periodicals, publications, newspapers, e-catalogs etc. The total number of books in the Central Library is 150,000. The whole library system is being computerized and online library service will be available through a network after the completion of the computerization process. A large number of International Research Journals are also available on Digital Library (provided by Higher Education Commission and research articles of interest can also be downloaded).

#### Digital Library

The University of Balochistan has access to digital library via PERN to provide researchers, faculty members and students of the University access to the International scholarly literature. The facility is based on electronic (online) delivery system. The Digital Library also provides access to high quality peer-reviewed journals database and articles on a wide range of discipline. The facility could be availed by the faculty members and students of the University. The facility is accessible through University of Balochistan internet/intranet.

Via Digital Library access to thousands of e-Resources including e-Books, e-Jorunalsetc is available. For the maximum utilization of Digital Libraries all over the World, the Directorate of Information Technology has established a Computer Lab in the Central Library and ensured its operation during University working hours, so that the faculty/students/researchers may benefit from it. This all has become possible due to the high speed connectivity of PERN (Pakistan Educational Research Network). The number of Computer Units in the digital library has been increased to 80.

#### Computer Laboratories:

Computers have been provided to the Departmental Computer Laboratories. This service is provided to the Central Library and to the Academic Departments/Institutes/Centers and available over long hours. In the Central Labs, PCs are provided, offering a range of standard office software for document creation and presentations. Specialist provision is available to support research and advanced study within the University. Computers in all departments / institutes / centers / sections are connected to the University's network operations center (Local Area Network and Wide Area Network (LAN/WAN)) that provides the internet/intranet connectivity via PERN.

#### Video Conference Center:

The University of Balochistan with the help of Higher Education Commission has established a Video Conferencing Center. The main objective of this Video Conference is to enhance student - teacher interaction through distance learning at global—level, bridge the gap of good faculty, meet the shortage of faculty members at the University and ultimately to uplift the standard of education in Balochistan.

#### Audio Visual Aids:

Audio-visual aids are used in the class rooms, seminars and conferences to facilitate the students learning process.



# *Quality Assurance Directorate (QAD) Establishment of QEC & Conversion of the Cell into Directorate*

QEC University of Balochistan is a regular part of University of Balochistan and was established in 2005 where it started functioning with approved budget of HEC in 2006. The University of Balochistan in its Finance and Planning Commission Committee held on May 2006 also approved the regularization of QEC. In view of extended responsibilities and create meaningful authority related to quality enhancement, it was considered to upgrade the Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC). In the reporting year (2012) notification was issued to convert the Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) into Quality Assurance Directorate (QAD). Though due financial constraints, new appointments have been replaced by capacity building of the existing staff.

#### VISION

Developing a viable and sustainable mechanism of quality Assurance in University of Balochistan in order to meet the rising challenges of transforming the Province into a knowledge based economy.

#### MISSION

To execute the program on quality assurance at the University of Balochistan through internal assessment

#### **OBJECTIVES OF QAD**

- 4. QEC is responsible for defining clear and explicit standards as points of reference to the reviews to be carried out. It should also help the employees to know as to what they could expect from candidates.
- 5. QEC is responsible to develop qualifications framework by setting out the attributes and abilities that can be expected from the holder of a qualification, i.e. Bachelors, Bachelor with Honors, Master's, M. Phil., and Doctoral.
- QEC is responsible to develop program specifications. These are standard set of information clarifying what knowledge, understanding, skills and other attributes a student will have developed on successfully completing a specific program.

# Completion of Self- Assessment Reports (SARs)

During the reporting period, QAD provided complete guidance to departments to complete their SARs in every respect; responding to all the eight criteria, Implementation Plan and Executive Summary; . The departments those succeeded in completing their SARs included 9 departments; Psychology, Zoology, Media and Journalism, Mathematics, Commerce, Economics, Institute of Management Sciences and Physics.

#### Implementation Plan

In the early phase of 2012, the Quality Assurance Directorate finalized the Implementation Plans of the departments; Botany, Statistics and Sociology. These were the Implementation Plans of the Self-Assessment Reports that which were finalized in December, 2011.

# **Executive Summaries**

Executive Summary is the document that summarizes the Self Assessment Report and is approved by the Vice Chancellor, University of Balochistan, Quetta. The QAD supported the departments to prepare standard executive summaries of their SARs to represent their reports. In the reporting period the QAD finalized the Executive Summaries of the Programs of the MSc. Botany, MSc. Statistics, MA. Sociology and M.Com Commerce.

# Printing of SARs

Despite the financial crunch, the University managed to print Self-Assessment Reports of five programs of five departments through QAD. The SARs of Institute of Bio-Chemistry, Department of Education, Department of International Relations, Department of Computer Sciences and Department of Library and Information Sciences related to their Masters' Program.

#### Conduction of Distribution Ceremony

To honour those departments who completed the task of Self-Assessment Reports (SARs) and motivate other departments to speed up their work on self-assessment process, a distribution ceremony was organized in order to distribute the SARs to the concerned departments. The ceremony was chaired by the Vice Chancellor, Dr. Rasool Bakhsh Raisani and other prominent participants where the Pro-Vice Chancellor, Director General Human Recourse and Administration, Registrar, DG Planning, Controller of Examination, all concerned Deans, Chairpersons of the concerned Departments. The Organizing Committee comprised of Prof. Dr. S.M. Arif Director QAD, Muhammad Iqbal Tareen, Assistant Director QAD and Abdul Khaliq Alizai, Data Analyst QAD These SARs are now available with concerned departments and QAD.



# Teacher & Course Evaluation by Students

In the reporting period, QAD initiated the Course and Teacher Evaluation by students. The process of teacher and course evaluation by students stopped in the university and there was a halt of three years. In 2013 the process was started and this evaluation was conducted for students of 15 departments. The analysis of the data was started at the end of 2012 which was completed and communicated to HEC in 2013. QAD successfully completed due to strong support of the top management.

#### Plagiarism Tests

The Quality Assurance Directorate, University of Balochistan Quetta tried its best to decentralize the plagiarism process conducted through the plagiarism detecting software (turnitin ). To meet the purpose, initial attempts have been made through letters served to the Deans / Chairpersons of the departments to convey the data for opening the accounts of all the faculty members,

M. Phil / Ph. D scholars as well as the focal persons of the department, so that, the plagiarism process can be decentralized as well as the best use of the software (turnitin) may be Ensured.

As per the requirement of Higher Education Commission all the M.Phil / Ph.D theses need to be passed through the "turnitin" software for plagiarism check. The QAD tested all the MPhil / Ph.D. theses for Plagiarism through








## **CHAPTER 6: UNIVERSITIES BUILDING ECONOMIES**

## Directorate of University Advancement/ Financial Aid Office (UA/FA)

- I. University Advancement/ Financial Aid Office (UA/FA) is responsible to convey the public and to all stakeholders a clear, consistent and focused message about the university's vision, mission, goals, priorities and performance that increase public understanding and support for improving the quality and effectiveness of academic programs, research, and services. The office is also responsible for the design, implementation and management of programs to raise funds for the university from different with particular emphasis upon the corporate sector, alumni, individual / private donors, and international partners.
- ii. Directorate of University Advancement and Financial Assistance (UA&FA), is focused on fostering mutually beneficial relationships with alumni, trusts/foundations, corporate sector, international partners, officials, the media, and the general public. The relationship will be based on fidelity and integrity to raise funds for the advancement of University of Balochistan.
- iii. Student Financial Assistance Office (SFAO) It is responsible for providing financial assistance to all needy students of University who are from the less developed areas of Pakistan, in general and Balochistan in particular as a way to increase access to higher education. The SFAO aim to foster mutually beneficial relationships with all our stakeholders as a means to raise funds for the needy students.
- iv. Career Services This office assists and supports students in their career decisions through career counseling, workshops and support services that have been designed to work to their advantage as they seek employment upon graduation. This office is responsible for reaching out to potential employers for increasing the employment opportunities for students. The Career Services Office will also be responsible for coordinating on campus "work study" and off campus student employment opportunities such as internships and cooperative education programs.



### **CHAPTER 8: Strengthening Technological Infrastructure**

#### Introduction to UoB IT Infrastructure:

To support and strengthen quality higher education, the UoB has state-of-art IT infrastructure connected via PERN. This UoB IT infrastructure includes In-Campus network connectivity (through fiber optics, UTP & wireless), computer labs that facilitate in providing faculty/students the access to internet and to digital library (E-Books, E-journals, UoB Library Catalogue's etc). Video conferencing facility is provided which is facilitating interactive learning, through which lectures are organized in different universities while the students and faculty attend them locally in UoB, with interactive questions and answers sessions. Furthermore, another important facility is that the faculty and students can download the latest Microsoft software products (via HEC-Microsoft Strategic Education Alliance Agreement).

## PERN2 (Pakistan Education and Research Network):

In 2010 UoB switched from PERN1 to PERN2, and presently UoB IT network is directly connected @30Mpbs (allocated bandwidth) to PERN2 that is a national research and education network of Pakistan which connects premiere educational and research institutions of the country. PERN has strengthened and equipped our faculty/students to focus on collaborative research, knowledge sharing, resource sharing, and distance learning by connecting people through the use of Intranet and Internet resources.



## **Digital Library:**

Faculty and students of UoB can directly access the digital library that provides access to international scholarly literature based on electronic (online) delivery, providing access to high quality, peer-reviewed journals, databases, articles and e-Books across a wide range of disciplines. This facility can be accessed from anywhere within the campus including the computer labs, office computers, laptops etc. To further facilitate the scholars/students for accessing the digital resources, dedicated modern computer labs have also been furnished within the central library. Additionally, the digital libraries facility can also be accessed from home by the faculty/students through UoB VPN (virtual private network) facility.

## Video Conferencing:

University of Balochistan has been using video conferencing facility since 2006. In session 2011-2012 we have attended about 60 sessions included trainings, seminars, workshops, meetings and Virtual Education Program Pakistan (VEPP).

#### **Campus Management Solution:**

UoB IT team has developed (in-house) a web-based campus management solution that has facilitated recording the registration and admission data. Furthermore, the same data has been linked to examination and step-wise the examination section of UoB is being shifted towards using this software and to utilize the software on all exams. The finance section also has a state-of-Art software system that helps in running day to day UoB financial business processes.

#### Web Portal& Email Facility:

UoB IT team has developed and deployed (in-house) UoB web portal (http://www.uob.edu.pk) running on a web-server hosted in-campus.

UoB email service, Digital library & UoB Library Catalogue, departmental information etc can be accessed by the staff/faculty/students through UoB web-portal. This portal is also equipped with search facility and furthermore a news section that facilitates in providing useful UoB happenings.

## **Development of Online Admission System:**

As already discussed above, the university has a self-developed automation system that also includes a web based online admission system but presently it has been limited to In-Campus use of the relevant section (carrying data entry, reporting etc) and it is expected that at a certain stage the same system would be linked/launched through internet, that will facilitate students by submitting their admission forms online.

## **INTRODUCTION**

## PLANT TISSUE CULTURE LABORATORY

Tissue culture is a method of plant propagation done in a Laboratory. There are many methods of plant propagation including using seeds, cuttings and division. Plant tissue culture involves growing plants in an artificial medium under sterile conditions in a jar, flask or test tube. In theory, this process can go on indefinitely, producing many plants over time.

## Some of the noteworthy findings of this Laboratory are:

- Production of virus free Banana plantlets by utilization of alternative carbon sources, gelling agents, matrices, water sources and light. About 2000 plants were supplied to the farmers of Uthal, Balochistan in year 2008. This project was completed at Governor House Quetta.
- Similar achievements in production of Potato and Pineapples were also obtained.
- Honored to be first and successful Lab of Plant Tissue Culture working in Balochistan from 2007 till date with continuous research projects.
- Played a key role in the conservation of Juniper and Chilgoza (Pinus gerardiana) using Plant Tissue Culture techniques.
- First successful attempt in obtaining in vitro shoot proliferation in Quetta pine.
- Plants grown in this Laboratory will be used in endangered species recovery work. One of the main focuses in this Lab is the germination, growth and multiplication of native terrestrial plant species.
- Currently there are three M.Phil. Registered Students are conducting their research work in this Lab and more than 5 MSc students of Botany department have competed there research from this Lab.
- Successful production of grapes which is a cash fruit of Balochistan is produced in high quality which is available throughout the year and can also generate revenue if proper marketing strategy will be adopted.



## **Botanical Garden University of Balochistan (BGUoB)**

### INTRODUCTION

Botanical gardens had now become scientific collections, as botanists published their descriptions of the new exotic plants, and these were also recorded for posterity in detail by superb botanical illustrations. In this century, botanical gardens effectively dropped their medicinal function in favor of scientific and aesthetic priorities, and the term "botanic garden" came to be more closely associated with the herbarium, library (and later laboratories) housed there than with the living collections – on which little research was undertaken.

The Botanical Gardens at University of Balochistan (BGUoB) was founded in 2006, it can be claimed that "the Botanical Garden is by far the richest in Balochistan" and no other university of Balochistan has Botanical Garden. Botanical Garden in UoB has been set up to cultivate new species introduced; they also helped found in-situ conservation. Its importance is related to ideas, knowledge, styles of economy, politics and goods were given international reach" and justified as the spreading of "civilization" through "development" and "improvement". From its earliest days to the present, BGUoB has in many ways exemplified botanic garden ideals, and is respected countrywide for the published work of its scientists, the education of horticultural students, its public programs, and the scientific underpinning of its horticulture.

### Purpose:

Three main purpose of botanical garden are Research, Conservation and Economical **Research** 

We in Botanical Garden assisting one post graduate and more than ten M.Phil students are doing their research work. Other students of life science are also doing there research work in botanical garden such as botany, pharmacy, geography.

#### Conservation

Second main purpose is conservation of different plant, maybe from tropical, sub tropical or temperate area. Botanical garden has green house for conservation of tropical plant such is palm tree, banana mango etc

#### Economical

Almost all the equipment of the research are available in Botanical garden of Balochistan University. There are two green houses for conservation of tropical plant and one green shade.






#### **CHAPTER: 10 SPORTS**

## Introduction

Higher Education Commission (HEC) intends to develop and endure a dynamic and internationally competitive research sector in Pakistan that makes a major contribution to economic prosperity, national well-being and the expansion and dissemination of knowledge. Promotion of Research is one of the core strategic goals of the HEC. Through the program and initiatives launched by the HEC for strengthening research and the process of knowledge creation, the quality and research output originating from the universities and institutes in the country have shown remarkable improvements and Pakistan has been acknowledged as rising star in a number of research disciplines in terms of percentage increase in internationally cited research publications. This office is established for not only sustaining but also improving the trends of the research activities having an impact for the improvement of areas concerning economic, industrial, social and academic development and their accelerated advancements for achieving the national objectives.

#### Mission

The purpose of the ORIC is to develop, expand, enhance and manage the university's research programs and to link research activities directly to the educational, social and economic priorities of the university and its broader community. The ORIC is also responsible for assuring that the quality of research reflects the highest international standards and advances the stature of the university among the world's best research institutions. In pursuit of this mission the ORIC has the responsibility of guaranteeing that all research programs and policies reflect the core values of academic freedom, professional integrity and ethical conduct and full compliance with all policies, legal requirements and operational standards of the University of Balochistan.

In view of the significant increase in number of post graduate students involved in research, enhancement in research projects, increase in publications and enhanced possibility of commercialization of research; it is equally important to build-up the capacity of the academic institutions of University of Balochistan to manage all research related activities. ORIC will positively set the pace to match-up to the challenges in the field of Research and Innovation.

To hold regular scientific seminars, colloquia, symposium etc. at UoB to promote the culture of interaction and sharing of scientific knowledge with researchers around the world



## Annual Progress Report 2012

## (1) Academics

CASVAB, University of Balochistan offers MPhil and PhD in the disciplines of Microbiology, Biotechnology and Molecular Biology, Nutrition and Toxicology and Physiology and Endocrinology. The status of postgraduate students is shown as under.

One of the CASVAB faculty members Dr. Abdul Malik, Assistant Professor has completed his Postdoc from Germany and re-joined CASVAB. Another faculty member Dr. Tauseef Asmat, Lecturer also completed his PhD from Germany and re-joined CASVAB. Likewise, two of CASVAB faculty members are close to finish their PhD degree (Life Sciences) from Australia (Abdul Waheed), and France (Zahid Mustafa).

Three of the CASVAB faculty members Zafar Ahmad (Microbiology), Nadeem Rashid (Nutrition and Toxicology) and Mohammad Alam Mengal (Physiology and Endocrinolog) enrolled at CASVAB submitted PhD thesis for evaluation. Similarly, Saadullah Jan, Assistant Professor enrolled at UVAS, Lahore also submitted PhD thesis for evaluation and reported back to CASVAB.

One of the faculty members Tahir Hameed, Assistant Professor who is enrolled at CASVAB after completion of PhD research at UVAS, Lahore re-joined CASVAB. Moreover one of faculty members Zia Uddin is doing PhD at GC University Lahore.

Assad Ullah lecturer CASVAB enrolled in PhD degree programme at BUITEMS, Quetta joined CASVAB after completion of nine months HEC-French PhD sandwich degree programme in France. Further, Mohammad Shafee, Lecturer at CASVAB and enrolled in PhD at CASVAB has proceeded to South Africa for six months under HEC, PhD split programme.

The classical and hi-tech laboratory paraphernalia is regularly used by the BSc and MSc students registered in the department of Microbiology, University of Balochistan, Quetta.

Few of the graduate and postgraduate students of Sardar Bhadar Khan Women's University (SBKU) Quetta, and Balochistan University of Information Technology Engineering and Management Sciences (BUITEMS) Quetta also have completed their research work at CASVAB. Further, the research work of some of the PhD nominees of Livestock department Balochistan enrolled at University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences (UVAS) Lahore and University of Agriculture Faisalabad (UAF) was also completed at CASVAB.

### (2) Vaccine production

The CASVAB has been producing quality vaccines against major diseases of livestock. Most of the vaccines are of first generation type. All the viral vaccines except FMD vaccine (inactivated) are freeze dried in order to increase the shelf life and quality of vaccine. Most of the bacterial vaccines are killed and adjuvanted with either saponin or aluminium hydroxide gel. The clostridial vaccines are bacterin cum toxoid in origin and produced on German Gottingen type fermenters. The major share (10 million doses) of vaccine production is supplied to Livestock and Dairy Development Department, Balochistan against a little grant of 3.5 million Pak rupees per year vide MOU signed between the Livestock department and CASVAB, University of Balochistan. Besides this the demand of veterinary biologicals produced at this Center is of great interest to Livestock department of other provinces and non-Government organizations. The production and distribution of various vaccines to these clients is shown as under.

# (3) Research & Development

Since the establishment of CASVAB, it was the main aim to highlight the research pertinent to livestock and poultry in Balochistan. Most of the MPhil and PhD research was focused on the current problems of livestock in Balochistan. Of the many research accomplishments following are the main highlights:

- 1: Diagnosis of mycoplasma diseases (Mmc, Mcc, Mccp, Mp, MmmSC) in goats by using Polymerase chain reactions (PCR).
- 2: Diagnosis of mycoplasma disease (Mycoplasma bovis and Mycoplasma mycoides subspecies mycoides Small colony) in cattle by using PCR.
- 3: Diagnosis of mycoplasma disease (Mycoplasma gallisepticum and Mycoplasma synoviae) in poultry by using PCR.
- 4: Detection of Mycobacterium tuberculosis (TB) in the sputum samples of humans through the PCR in Quetta.
- 5: Standardization of Latex agglutination test (LAT) in the quantification of antibodies against mycoplasma disease of goats in Balochistan.
- 6: Use of indirect hemagglutination assay (IHA) in the quantification of antibodies against mycoplasma diseases of cattle in Balochistan.
- 7: Production of an efficacious vaccine against bovine respiratory disease caused by Mycoplasma bovis using local field isolates of Balochistan.
- 8: Standardization and use of HPLC and TLC for the detection of Mycotoxin in poultry feed in Balochistan.
- **9:** Use of adsorbents to neutralize the Mycotoxin present in the poultry feed.
- **10:** Standardization of Molecular Satellite (STR) in checking the purity of sheep breeds in Balochistan.

### (4) Visits of CASVAB

The worthy Vice Chancellor and Registrar of Lasbela University of Agriculture, Water and Marine Sciences (LUAWMS) Uthal visited University of Balochistan and CASVAB and requested Worthy Vice Chancellor of University of Balochistan to strengthen LUAWMS in terms of faculty and laboratories. After approval from the competent authority, CASVAB donated laboratory equipments along with chemicals, media, reagents, plastic and glass wares. Further, Dr. Mohammad Arif Awan, Assistant Professor and Dr. Mohammad Masood Tariq, Assistant Professor visited LUAWMS and pointed out the gaps and helped them out to develop the systematic procedures to procure laboratory equipments and consumables through tendering.

Under the Internship programme, three (3) graduates from the Department of Microbiology, UoB and twelve (12) DVM graduates from LUAWMS, Uthal Balochistan were trained in various laboratories for one month.

Number of faculty and students from SBK Womens' University Quetta and BUITEMS Quetta, paid visits to CASVAB and seen its classical and state of the art laboratories. Moreover, joint research proposals have been discussed with the visiting faculty members.

## (5) New Director, CASVAB

Dr. Mohammad Arif Awan, Assistant Professor, CASVAB has been appointed as Director CASVAB on 05 October, 2012, by the worthy Vice Chancellor, as Dr. Ferhat Abbas the former Director CASVAB could not continue due to personal reasons.

### (6) Disease control vaccination camps

Selected districts such as Mastung, Killa Saifullah, Loralai, Ziarat, and Pishin of Balochistan have been visisted for vaccination camps. This activity has familiarized the animal owners in terms of disease control via effective vaccination programme. The campaign was undertaken with the collaboration of Livestock & Dairy Development Department Balochistan & Balochistan Rural Support Programme.

- 6) Small scale Mosque


# (12) Bottlenecks

### **Electric load shedding**

CASVAB has been aiming for quality research and vaccine production since its establishment in 2005. In this regards, expensive laboratory equipments and microbial seed cultures used for the vaccine production need continuous supply of electricity. Unfortunately the frequent electric load shedding has been causing serious losses to the laboratory hard- wares, viability of the microbial seed cultures and hindrance in the process of vaccine production. The available standby electric generators could not be the sole solution as they require huge consumption of fuel which is not affordable and cost effective as well. The dedicated line for the electric supply is the only solution for Centers such as CASVAB.

### Security measures

Currently security is of top priority of various departments, institutes, organizations, and academic institutes in Pakistan. Unfortunately this issue has not been properly addressed for CASVAB on the part of University of Balochistan. There has been an impressing need for the posting of security guards from the University pool of Police force. The immediate measures to post suitable numbers of university police at CASVAB should be taken.





#### ANNAUL/PROGRESS REPORT OF 2011-12

#### A. ACADEMIC REPORT

### 1. Completion of First Batch of LL.M. Degree Program

By the grace of Almighty Allah, we have been successful in completing the very First Batch of LL.M. Degree Program. Though during the entire period of two years of this First Batch we faced enumerable problems in shape of Resource Persons and technical skills but the determination, sincerity and hard work of all the concerned persons paved way to the vivid reality of LL.M. Degree Program run by University Law College, Quetta.

### 2. Admissions to 2nd Batch of LL.M.

After successful completion of the First Batch of LL.M. Degree Program the College announced admissions to the 2nd Batch and after conducting of Entry Test, more than 20 students had been enrolled in this 2nd Batch. A splendid welcome party was arranged in the lash green lawns of University Law College, Quetta for the students of 2nd Batch of LL.M. in which, among other dignitaries, the Honourable Chief Justice of Pakistan, the Honourable Judges of Supreme Court and High Court, Members of Bench and Bar and the worthy Vice Chancellor, Deans and Professors of University of Balochistan, participated.

### 3. Submission of Proposal to Open Society for Initiation of ULC Legal Clinic

Open Society, a US-based non-governmental organization, called proposals from Law Colleges and other relevant institutions for initiation of Legal Clinic, aim at providing free legal expertise and supports to needy persons. University Law College, Quetta, had submitted its proposal for the same which was accepted for a grant of Rs. 20,000,00/-

### 4. Initiation of ULC Legal Clinic Program: A Project Sponsored by Open Society

Open Society accepted the proposal of University Law College, Quetta, submitted in 2011 for an initial amount of 20,000,00/- After which Law College, Quetta initiated ULC Legal Clinic Program, in 2012.

#### 5. Initiation of LL.B. Executive Session:

Taking into consideration, the long lasting demand of the executive section of the society, University Law college, finally initiated another LL.B. Study program, in 2012, for in-service personals who are unable to study during Morning or Evening Sessions.

### 6. Attendance

University Law College, Quetta, strictly adhered with the attendance rules as has been prescribed by University of Balochistan. Those students who did not secured 75% attendance were restrained from appearing in annual examinations. Particularly in 2012 more than 150 students could not appear in the annual examination due to attendance percentage restrictions.

### 7. Examinations of LL.B. and LL.M.

Due to tough schedule of the Examination Centre of University of Balochistan there was a slight delay in conducting the examinations of LL.B., in 2011. However, the dates for LL.M. were decided through mutual deliberation of the Examination Centre of University of Balochistan and Administration of University Law College, Quetta, and the examinations were conducted as per said schedule. Moreover, in 2012 annual examinations, University Law College, Quetta, also involved itself in the examination process for the purpose to stop cheating trends in its students.

The ULC team; along with the teams from leading university and law colleges of Paksitan, participated in First Round of the competition which was written and ULC, Quetta Team secured second position. Then the team fled to Islamabad for participation in second round and reached to semi final after beating International Islamic University, Islamabad.

### 2. 1st Position in International Moot Court Competition Held at New Delhi Islamabad

University Law College, Quetta received another invitation for a Moot Court Competition to be Held by National Law University, New Delhi with the collaboration of CDR. University Law College Team (consisting on Asmatullah Kakar (LL.M.
