## **Abstract:**

Afghanistan, a completely landlocked country, is located in the heart of South Central Asia. Afghanistan's physical geography has had a profound impact on the country's history and culture. This was further intensified by foreign occupation, first by USSR in 1979 and then by the US in 2001 in order to topple the government of the Taliban.
